Rocklin Community - The suburban city of Rocklin lies twenty miles northeast of Sacramento. It has a population of 73,261. Rocklin has 2,490 total businesses and 21,211 employees with a current unemployment rate of 3.1%, and a median household income of \$113,634. Approximately 49% of Rocklin citizens hold a bachelor's degree or higher.

Rocklin High School - Rocklin High School is one of two four-year comprehensive high schools within the Rocklin Unified School District. The current enrollment is 1976 students. The academic year is based on two semesters, each approximately 18 weeks in length. Rocklin High School is on an eight period rotating block schedule where students attend four classes one day and the other four the next with a 30-minute student support period each day.

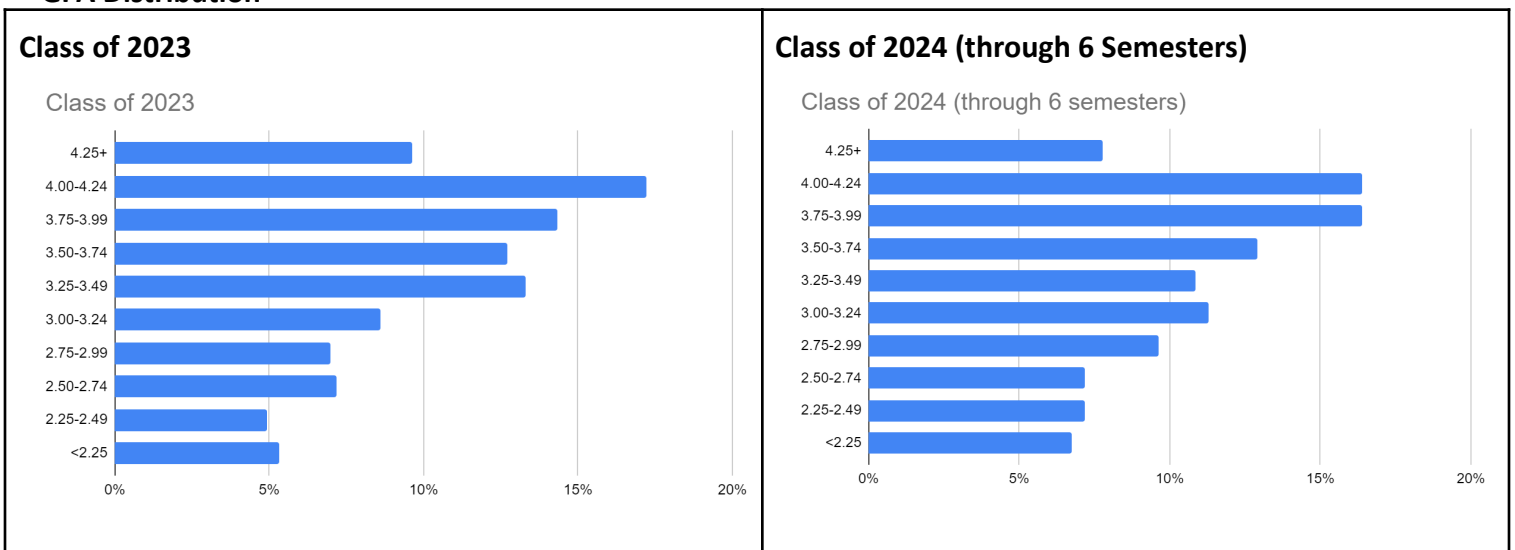
Grading and Graduation Requirements - Rocklin High School uses both a weighted (5.0) and unweighted (4.0) grading scale. The RHS educational philosophy rests on the belief that all students will master the learning associated with the common set of standards in each course. Because of this, RHS does not issue letter grades of "D" or "F." Any student earning below a 70% in a course or who has not demonstrated mastery will receive a no credit "NC" and will need to retake the course if it is required for graduation. Course requirements for graduation are as follows:

Language Arts	4 years	Foreign Language	1 year
Science	3 years	Technology	1 year
Social Science	3.5 years	Visual/Perf. Arts	1 year

Physical Education	3 years	Elective	5 years

In addition to these course requirements, students must complete a minimum of 25 hours of documented community service. The average student completed 55 hours and 10% of the students in the class of 2023 completed 150+ hours and were recognized for their distinguished service. Together, the class of 2023 performed 26,655 hours of community service work.

Matriculation - From the class of 2023, 89% of graduates sought post-secondary education immediately after graduation. 47% matriculated to 4-year, degree-granting institutions, 42% to community college, 5% took a gap year or had *other plans, 3% entered the workforce, 1% attended tech or trade schools, and 1% of students enlisted in the military. (*Other includes mission work or undecided responses). 74% of graduates met UC/CSU A-G Requirements.

CHANGES DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Fall semester 2020 began with two major changes. Rocklin High School moved from an eight-period rotating block schedule to a 4X4 block schedule. Students still had up to eight classes per year, but only four each term (fall/spring). In addition to the scheduling change, the fall semester began with 100% distance learning which continued through the first quarter. Throughout the 2020-21 school year, Rocklin High School moved from a completely virtual format to a hybrid learning model in which students attended in-person instruction two or three days per week and worked independently on assignments at home on alternating weekdays and then eventually returned to full time on campus instruction in April 2021. The 2021-2022 school year resumed in a fully in-person structure with an 8 period rotating block and has remained as such since.

Advanced Coursework - Rocklin High School offers advanced, honors, Advanced Placement (AP), and dual enrollment (DE) level courses. AP and DE courses are not typically offered to freshmen and limited for sophomores. RHS transcripts reflect a weighted grade for honors and AP courses, but not for advanced or dual enrollment courses even though they are considerably more rigorous than the same standard course. Dual enrollment students receive high school credit on the RHS transcript as well as college credit on a separate transcript from Sierra College. The following are the DE classes offered:
